
MHS ALUMNI 2009



The Class of 1959 members will be celebrating their 50th reunion in 2009. As with many other 1950's classes, the Class of 1959 had no yearbook. Old newspapers and records from classmates and their families keep this history alive.

The MJH Commencement exercises were held in the Junior High School Auditorium (today's Middle School) on Wednesday, May 16, 1956, for 44 members as listed: Murl Anderson, Bert Avery, Ruby Barker, Jo Boling, Naomi Burgess, Harold Burris, Patsy Caddell, Betty Chapman, Helen Colbert, Gwen Crawford, James A. Faculty at the MJHS included: Lee T. McMahan, Principal; Louella Moore, Math; Pearl Rude, English and Social Science; Ruth Mosby, English and Social Science; Frances Phipps, Science and Reading; Odie Jones, Home Economics; Berniece Gaylord, Vocal Music and Larry Cooper, Band. **Note:** Mr. Cooper is living in Sayre, Oklahoma, in 2009, where he retired from the Sayre ISD.

<u>Three years later, according to the Mangum Star</u>, May 27, 1959, the Senior Class Day program was held Tuesday afternoon in the "old" high school auditorium which was standing where today's "new" gym stands. That school burned in 1962. Elaine Hughey received the \$100

B&PW scholarship from Mrs. Harold McDaniel, club president. Ray Hogan, principal, presented \$75 scholarships from Epsilon Sigma Alpha to Bonnie Hall and Nancy Wharton. Beta Sigma Phi presented a \$75 scholarship to Jill Scott.

Oklahoma Honor Society certificates went to: Bonnie Hall, Jill Scott, Nancy Wharton, Stanley Conrad, Orphie Neathery, Sharon Bailey, Margaret Winters, Sammy Harlan, Bobby Crane, Robbie Snipes, Arlen Gable and Phillip Carder. The upper ten percent of high school scholastic leaders are eligible for state society memberships.

The National Honor Society certificates were awarded to: Nancy Wharton, Eula Mae Stehr, Bob Lewis, Orphie Neathery, Nancy Van Vacter, Robbie Snipes and Mary McDonald.

Fourteen English students, pupils of Miss Tom Johnson, were honored for writing poems published in the 1959 anthology compiled by the Southern School Association. Each was awarded a copy of the anthology. This group included two seniors: Bonnie Hall and Bill McAdams.

Chosen by the highschool faculty, **Bob Lewis** was recognized as the **All-Around Boy and Nancy Wharton as the All-Around Girl. John Uecke** was the faculty's nomination for outstanding citizenship. **Kenny Parker** was chosen as the top boy athlete and **Jan Martin** as the outstanding girl in sports. The title of All-Around band student was conferred on **Joyce Barker**.

Nancy Wharton received the good citizenship award by Daughters of the American Revolution, Altus chapter. The Danforth Foundation Award for leadership went to Joe Boyd Thompson and Bonnie Hall.

Murl Anderson, class president, presented a gift to Mr. and Mrs. Bob Barnett, senior class parents; he also presented the class picture to Mangum High School.

Senior commencement was held May 21, 1959, in the "Old" High School Gym. It's still standing today directly east of the "new" gym. The prelude and processional were played by Maryanne McDonald. Invocation was given by Rev. Allen Anderson. Jill Scott gave the Salutatory address followed by a bassoon solo by John Uecke. Bonnie Hall gave the valedictory speech followed by a vocal solo performed by Eula Mae Stehr. Mr. Aaron, Superintendent of Schools introduced the speaker, James P. Garrett, former MHS graduate. Mr. Hogan, principal, presented the class and Leon Freeman, President of the Board of Education, presented the diplomas. Benediction was led by Rev. Allen Anderson.
